'How do you get infected with toxoplasmosis? You can come in contact with the parasite that causes the infection through:

- Eating raw or undercooked meat
- Eating unwashed fruits and vegetables
- Touching cat poop
- Touching kitchen utensils and cutting boards used to prepare raw or undercooked meat and fruits and vegetables
- Touching dirt or sand'

To keep the cats and keep them healthy, quiet and under populated, they need to be Trapped, Neutered, and Returned (TNR). There are clinics and non-profit organizations that specialize in this.
